Professor Konstantinos GEORGIADIS Vice-Rector of the University of Peloponnese

During the organization of the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens he was a member of the 17 member Executive Board of the "Athens 2004" Organising Committee for the Olympic Games.

For five consecutive times, from 1992 up to 2012, he has been elected member of the Executive Committee of the International Society of Olympic Historians (ISOH), while he has been honored with the Vikelas Plaque (2007) by the International Society of Olympic Historians (ISOH) for his contribution to the Olympic research.
